Welcome



<u>History</u> - We will be focussing on WW1 Life in the past 100 years and famous people.

Science - This term we will be studying forces.

<u>Design and Technology</u> - The children will develop their skills using re-cycled materials to make a new toy.

<u>Geography</u> - We will develop our knowledge of Europe.

<u>Art</u> - The children will focus on the artists Picasso and Monet and look at Cubism.

<u>ICT-</u> The children will develop their word processing skills. They will use I pads particularly for Numeracy and research. We will also study internet safety and multi- media.

<u>Music</u>- In our lessons the children will find out about famous composers and develop their singing, listening and composing skills. We will learn some World War 1 songs.

<u>PE</u> The focus will be on developing ball skills through simple rugby and football games.

<u>R E</u>- We will focus on the question What makes Jesus an inspiration to some people?



<u>PSCHE</u> This term we will be having metacognition lessons which focus on how we can improve our learning. We will investigate relationships and the importance of British values.

<u>Literacy</u>- This term we will be focussing on realistic fiction and writing newspaper reports, poetry, instructions and letters. Spellings to learn at home will be given out on Fridays.

Reading We are aiming for your child to have a love of books and reading. It is very important that children read and share their reading at home and we hope that you enjoy this special time together. Please encourage your child to de-code new words using their knowledge of phonics and look and say words. To help your child to understand more about a book, challenge their understanding by using questions eg. What do you think the main character was thinking? What would you do if you were in this story? What could happen next? Why do you think the character felt like that? Think of questions based around Who, Why, What, When, Where? If your child is reluctant to read at home please talk to us and we will see how we can help. Please sign your child's reading record book to show that they have read and remind them to change their reading book when it is finished. We will be expecting the children to take responsibility for changing their books.

We do plan to have a special Homework Challenge. We will send out another letter about by 9th
October and the children will have 5
weeks to complete the challenge.

Numeracy

Some of the basic requirements that the children need to know this term and you could help them with include the following:-

Count and represent numbers to 100 eg. show 42 as 4 tens and 2 ones or 42 ones

Use the addition symbol to express numbers to 100 eq. 73 can be written as 70+3=73

Use a place value chart to show different numbers

Use the symbols < and > and = to write number sentences.

To confidently count in 2s, 5s, and 10s, To also count in 3s.

To begin to use the multiplication and division signs.

To recognise and use symbols for pounds (£) and

Pence (p). To combine amounts to make a particular value.

To find different combinations of coins that equal the same amount of money.

To develop strategies for reasoning to solve problems.
