World War 1 Day – Tuesday 27th November 2018

Next Tuesday, children from Silver Birch, Maple, Horse Chestnut, Hawthorn, Beech and Oak classes will be taking part in a World War 1 day at school.

During the day, the children will visit a trench, undertake drill practise, learn how to bandage a wounded soldier, perform role play, move “water bombs” and how to keep their “chin up” in tough circumstances. We ran a similar day four years ago and it was incredibly successful.

To maximise the children’s enjoyment, we need the children to attend school in their oldest play clothes and shoes/boots - something that you don’t mind them getting muddy or wet. We also ask that they bring a towel and a spare set of clothes to get changed into. This is because every child will have an opportunity to undertake a “muddy scramble” course around the field.

School start times, lunch times and finish times will remain the same and the children will be able to have their normal lunch (school dinner or pack up).
