Homework Projects

Following a study of World War 1 Poetry and novels connected with that time the KS2 children have written some wonderful poems and created some lovely poppies from clay.

Horse Chestnut Class produced a thoughtful and moving assembly based on the themes of World War 1 and remembrance.

Royal Armouries visit

Horse Chestnut, Silver Birch and Maple classes enjoyed a visit to the Royal Armouries in Leeds, where they explored the museum, watched re-enactments of battles and had demonstrations on how historical weapons were used in warfare.



Our Year 6 attended a Commemoration Service at Christ Church with other local schools. The Service included readings and poems from participants in the war, together with a narration covering some of the history of World War 1 songs. The Service finished with The Last Post and the hymn "Make me a channel of your Peace."



World War 1 Day

Oak, Beech, Hawthorn, Horse Chestnut, Maple and Silver Birch took part in a World War 1 day in school. During the day, the children visited a trench, undertook drill practice, learned how to bandage wounded soldiers and how to keep their "chin up" in tough circumstances. We have had a change from the Wednesday Walk and the children have enjoyed a Wake Up and Shake Up session with Rachel from Sporting Influence. It was thoroughly enjoyed by everybody.

If you are a parent or carer of a child living in North Yorkshire, who is eligible to start primary school (i.e. a child born between 1 Sep 2014 and 31 Aug 2015 inclusive) or transfer from infant to junior school (i.e. a child born between 1 Sep 2011 and 31 Aug 2012) during the academic year 2018 / 2019, you will need to apply online for a primary school place at www.northyorks.gov.uk/admissions.

Paper applications can be requested by contacting 01609 533679. You must submit either an online or a paper application form no later than 15 January 2019. Late applications received after this date will be dealt with after those received on time.
