As you are probably already aware, I'm pleased to tell you that we are working with the NSPCC, the UK's leading children's charity, who have already delivered their *Speak out. Stay safe*. Programme in two seperate assemblies to our Infants and Juniors on Thursday 17<sup>th</sup> January. This is a nationwide programme for every primary-school-aged child in the UK and Channel Islands. They will also be delivering a workshop for our Year 5/6 children on Friday 1<sup>st</sup> February.

Through child-friendly, interactive assemblies and workshops their specially trained staff and volunteers will give our children information about how to keep themselves safe from harm and how to get help if they have any worries, sensitively discussing issues like bullying and sexual abuse, without using scary words or adult language.

We have studied the content of the materials and they have visited the school before and we are extremely confident that they are appropriate for primary-school-aged children. By the end of their visit, we are convinced children will feel empowered – knowing how they can speak out and stay safe.
