**Year 6 Residential Visit to Marrick Priory**

We are currently finalising the arrangements for the Year 6 Residential Visit to Marrick Priory. I know that the children are really looking forward to their visit and will enjoy taking part in a range of activities and making the most of their time there. It really is a lovely place!

However, in the interests of everyone's health and safety, I must stress that parents must be available to arrange collection of their child from Marrick Priory if there are any incidents of poor behaviour, which cause danger to any member of the group, or the individual concerned. Please take some time to talk to your child about the high expectations that all of us have of them.

Attached to this letter is a **Medical/Consent Form**, which is to be returned by **Monday 23<sup>rd</sup> March**. In addition, the final date for payment is **Monday 23<sup>rd</sup> March** and all outstanding contributions need to be in by this date.

If your child requires **Medicine**, including travel sickness tablets, **A Request to Administer Medication Form** (available from the school office) will need to be completed and returned to school by **Monday 30<sup>th</sup> March**. All medicines must be labelled with your child's name and dosage details and handed into the School Office on arrival at school on Monday 20<sup>th</sup> April.

There will be 3 staff members accompanying the children on this visit, who are Mrs Hazell, Mr Adams and one other to be confirmed.

As Monday 20<sup>th</sup> April is a staff training day, the children should arrive in school at 11.00am, please use the main entrance. The coach will **leave school at 11:30am**. **Please ensure that your child has a packed lunch on the Monday**. On that day, the children should attend school ready for their first activity at Marrick, which will be orienteering; therefore the children should wear jogger bottoms/casual trousers – **not jeans**.

The children will return to school on Friday 24<sup>th</sup> April at lunchtime, they will have been provided with a packed lunch by Marrick which they will eat in school. The children may be collected from school at 1:00pm onwards or stay until the end of the school day at 3.15pm.

The children will be placed in 3 groups for their activities. All groups will have a qualified instructor from the centre and be accompanied by a member of staff.

The children can take £10 - £12 pocket money for the tuck shop/souvenir shop plus a visit to the local Ice Cream Parlour on one of the evenings.
